- **Project Location:** 4804 Central Ave SE -or- Isleta and Rio Bravo intersection -or- Along Eubank Boulevard from Academy north to Paseo Del Norte. A map may also be included.
- **Scope of Improvement:** A new fire station is 'Area or Neighborhood', new library materials is 'County-Wide' while renovations to a specific library is 'Area or Neighborhood'.
- **Estimated Use:** A better intersection will decrease congestion - approximately 50,000 vehicles pass through this intersection per week.
- **Criteria:** Public Safety – police, fire, pedestrian safety, flood protection; Public Health – hospital, water or sewer line; Economic Development – promotes private investment and business creation; Quality of Life - Parks, museums, libraries; Service Delivery – computers, special equipment, capital to improve delivery of public services.
