1. CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order at 12:30 pm by Vice-Chair Richmond.

2. APPROVAL OF AGENDA

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Lewinger moved that the minutes of December 2012 be approved as presented, Scharman seconded. Motion passed.

4. NEW BUSINESS

ATP Program

DSAP Director, Katrina Hotrum stated that the ATP Program Manager was out sick and that she would be briefing the DWI Planning Council on the ATP jail-based and CAP programs.

ATP Program- is a ASAM level III.5 clinically managed jail-based intensive treatment program that uses the Community Reinforcement Approach (CRA). ATP is offered at MDC to provide clients with addiction treatment needs with evidence based addiction treatment services while incarcerated at Bernalillo County MDC. Goals for this program are to 1) Provide addiction treatment services to incarcerated individuals. 2) Reduce the impact of addiction related arrest and subsequent incarcerations at MDC. 3) Enhance overall public safety in Bernalillo County

CAP Program – is a ASAM level I outpatient treatment program that uses the Community Reinforcement Approach (CRA). CAP serves Bernalillo County residents who are released from MDC on electronic monitoring; ankle bracelets through CCP. CAP is part of a continuum of care for those requiring assistance to maintain a substance abuse free lifestyle.

5. OLD BUSINESS

DSAP Update

Final touchups are being done to the FY13 Distributions and Detox Grants. The grants will be presented to the Bernalillo County Commission on January 22, 2013. The grant is due in Santa Fe by February 18, 2013.

DSAP has partnered with UNM & APD to fund the Sobriety Observation Pilot (SOP). The SOP has shown to be effective regarding the impact that public inebriates have on going to jail or to UNMH. On Tuesday and Thursday, APD patrols for public inebriates who are then brought to DSAP. Presbyterian Hospitals and AFD are looking to join in on the SOP program.

Fran Martinez-Romero reported that DSAP representatives will be attending the DFA grant council meeting in April to receive information regarding the amount of funding that Bernalillo County can apply for the FY 14 grants.

6. PUBLIC COMMENT

Susan McKee with APS Crossroads program was attending of APS council representative Leslie Kelly. Ms. McKee briefed the council on the Crossroads program and stated that she would like the opportunity to present information to the board at a future meeting.
