10. Brief description of what 1 <sup>st</sup> unit on the scene saw.	Fully involved Work shop with a House and Propane tank as exposures, High winds pushing the fire to the forest.
11. Total time to bring fire under control	22 minutes of intense firefighting by crews to keep the house from becoming involved, the propane tank exploding and the forest from catching on fire.
12. Anyone inside at the time of the fire. If yes, how many	Male Resident was on scene and trying to put the fire out in the workshop
13. How was family alerted? (smoke detector, neighbors)	Witnessed the fire.
14. Injuries? If yes, include age, gender, transport info & injuries sustained.	No occupant injuries
15. Fire Origin? Was it contained to origin?	The fire was not contained to origin the backyard and House were affected by the fire.
16. Spread through %	Work shop and all equipment was a total loss. House was 20% involved.
17. Smoke Damage (light or heavy smoke damage throughout)	Light smoke damage in the residence because of broken windows from the impingement and heat from the outside fire.
18. Cause (determined/undetermined -->accident,natural,incendiary)	Under Investigation
19. Estimated Damages (structural, contents/vehicle)	Resident claims 8000 dollars in loss.
20. Assisting Agencies like Red Cross, # of displaced?	None
21. Contributing factors such as wind or location	Wind was a big contributing factor moving the fire through the yard west towards the forest area.
22. Additional information (rescues, FF injuries and so on)	One Firefighter Burn Injury. Injury was to the hand due to equipment malfunction.
