Real Property Notices of Value Letters are in the Mail

Bernalillo County Assessor Tanya R. Giddings announces that the Assessors' office will send out 264,987 Real Property 2018 Notices of Value (NOV) including manufactured homes to all property owners beginning March 29 informing them of their net taxable value of their property as of January 1. These assessments will be a factor in determining the 2018 property tax bills the Bernalillo County Treasurer's Office will mail in November of this year. The 2018 Notices of Value for business personal property and livestock will be sent out to property owners on May 1. If a property owner disagrees with the county Assessor's valuation on the property they can protest, they have until Monday, April 30 at 5 p.m. to file a protest form. A protest form can be filed online on the **assessor's website**, or in person at the main office, 501 Tijeras Ave. NW. Property owners have until April 30 to apply for property tax exemptions that could help lower their property tax bill in November. These exemptions include head of family, veterans and 100 percent disabled veterans. Applications for these exemptions can be downloaded from the **assessor's website** or picked up in person. The Assessor's Office has a dedicated phone bank set up to help property owners who have questions or need assistance. The number to call is **(505) 222-3700**.
