

Report Highlights


- The MDC on-site population has been at or below the 1,950 cap for over five years.
- Bookings, releases, and length of stay (LOS) decreased from October 2019 to November 2019.

- While the MDC population increased during the first part of 2019, in recent months the population has decreased, from 1,561 in September 2019 down 6.6% to 1,458 in November 2019.
- The Community Custody Program (CCP) population has remained steady over the past several months ranging from 71 to 76 inmates per month between September and November 2019.




Bookings, Releases, and Length of Stay

- Jail population is affected by two factors: how many people are booked and how long they stay.
- Bookings decreased 9.5% from 1,921 in October 2019 to 1,755 in November 2019. Releases decreased 23.4% from 2,078 in October 2019 to 1,684 in November 2019.
- The number of bookings were nearly identical from November 2018 to November 2019 although there were fewer releases. There were 0.8% (14) fewer bookings and 6.8% (114) fewer releases in November 2019.



- The LOS in November 2019 was 23.6 days, 1.2 days higher than the LOS of 22.4 days in November 2018, an increase of 5.4%. The LOS decreased 4.1 days (14.8%) from October 2019 to November 2019.
