

Report Highlights


- The MDC on-site population increased during Sept 2019, from 1,450 on September 1st to 1,515 (a 4.5% increase) on September 30th.
- Bookings increased 0.3% from 2,255 in August 2019 to 2,263 in September 2019.

- The MDC population began increasing in late 2017. It continued to increase 2019 until a recent decrease in July and August 2019. Between January 2019 and August 2019 the population increased 10.5%
- During September 2019 the Community Custody Program (CCP) population increased from 61 individuals to 80 individuals.




BOOKINGS, RELEASES, AND LENGTH OF STAY

- Jail population is affected by two factors: how many people are booked and how long they stay.
- Bookings increased 0.3% from 2,255 in August 2019 to 2,263 in September 2019. Releases decreased 1.3% from June 2019 to July 2019.
- The number of bookings and releases were higher in September 2019 than in September 2018. There were 12.6% (254) more bookings in 2019 and 11.6% (230) more releases.



- The LOS for September 2019 was 21.2 days, 3 days higher than the LOS of 18.2 days in September 2018, an increase of 16.5%. The LOS increased .4 days (1.9%) from August 2019 to September 2019.
