11. Total time to bring fire under control	Second incident resolved at 2:17 AM, all 4 subjects made it off trail without incident and brought down the tram by SAR personnel and APD Open Space. BCFD Station 35, Station 46 and Albuquerque Ambulance standing by to provide medical care for all subjects. Second incident turned over to NMSAR, SAR personnel and APD Open Space walking subjects down to Elena Gallegos picnic area. BCFD Battalion 6 and Battalion 7 assisted with Incident Command and management.
