Captive Citizens: Leveraging Indigenous Captivity for Citizenship in Progressive Era Arizona

Presenter: Maurice Crandall

Bio: Maurice Crandall is a citizen of the Yavapai-Apache Nation of Camp Verde, Arizona. He earned his PhD from the University of New Mexico, and since 2017, he has been an assistant professor of Native American Studies at Dartmouth College, where he focuses on the Indigenous peoples of the U.S. - Mexico Borderlands.

Genízaro Identity, Dignity and the Law

Presenter: Bill Piatt

Bio: Bill Piatt is a Professor of Law, and the former Dean, at St. Mary's University School of Law in San Antonio, Texas. He has taught, practiced and written extensively for decades in the areas of civil rights, including race relations, language rights, immigration and human trafficking.

Genízaro Identity and DNA - The Helix of Our Native American Genetic History

Presenter: Miguel A. Tórrez

Bio: Miguel A. Tórrez is a Research Technologist for Los Alamos National Lab and Administrator for the New Mexico Genealogical Society's DNA Project (NMGS DNA Project). Miguel has worked with traditional genealogy for 17 years and genetic genealogy for 13 years. Miguel is one of the pioneers in this field within the scope of New Mexico history. Miguel will discuss what genetic genealogy has revealed about the complex Mestizaje among Nuevomexicanos.
