

The Bernalillo County Mobile Voting Unit will be placed at or near a different senior facility throughout Bernalillo County each day during early voting from 8 a.m. - 5 p.m. and is open to all qualified registered Bernalillo County voters.

Halloween UBER Codes

BernCo and NMDOT are joining with Uber and Cumulus Media to offer patrons 1000 free or low-cost Uber rides during the six days leading up to Halloween. Just download the Uber app to your phone and enter the code ABQTREAT18. Rides will be available from Friday, Oct. 26 beginning at noon through Thursday, Nov.1 ending at 3 a.m. By using the code, riders will receive a credit up to \$10, for up to two trips per person. The credit can only be used for rides, not Uber Eats, and the discount does not cover tip.

Five tips for a fun, not frightful, Halloween night!

Halloween is CREEPING up on us! Bernalillo County wishes everyone a safe and happy Halloween experience. Take a minute to read these 5 tips to make sure you and your family stay safe while trick-or-treating.

- 1. Trick-or-treat with trusted neighbors.
- 2. Dress like a ghoul or goblin, but stay safe. Make sure costumes and candy bags or pails are reflective. Costumes shouldn't drag too far on the ground to avoid tripping, and masks, hats, and shoes should be well-fitting.

 3. If you plan to be driving during trick-ortreat hours, watch for children walking on roadways, medians, and curbs. Be sure
- 4. **Use well-marked routes** to get to the candy. Always use the sidewalk, and do not cut across yards or use alleys. Wherever possible, cross the road at a crosswalk.

to enter and exit driveways carefully.

5. When in doubt, throw the candy out. Avoid candy that has loose wrappings, is completely unwrapped, has puncture holes, or is homemade and not factory-wrapped. **Boo safe out there!**



Recycle plastic bottles and aluminum cans, but NOT candy wrappers.





BernCo Passes Minimum Wage Increase

The minimum wage will increase from \$8.85 to \$9.05 per hour. The increase will take effect on Jan. 1, 2019. This wage increase affects employees who work within the unincorporated area of BernCo, outside of the city limits.
