Members suggested that this is an emotionally charged subject, and the work is very time consuming. With the division of community and system this could have led to the demise of leadership. There was also discussion of training for the person(s) who take on leadership for RRED, and what that commitment may look like for someone who takes on this committee.

Some questions/suggestions that came up:

- 1.) Should there be a time limit on Leadership? A one year cap, etc.
- 2.) What does the hand-off of Leadership look like, and are the last Chairs willing to do this?
- 3.) Race and class are at the root of what we are trying to work on so we need more awareness of the issues, trainings to continue constantly

- **Commitment of members**
 - We want to discuss the time and location of meeting, and what works best for everyone to get the most attendance
 - In order to look at goals as a committee we need commitment from members to engage and stay in attendance as much as possible
 - Who should we see attending the meetings, and should we have conversations with members who have stopped attending?

Members would like to see Law Enforcement involved, and possibly provide training to officers on what we are doing. Members definitely want to see more youth with a suggestion that youth be a part of leadership. Another piece people feel is missing is APS. Members want to see educators at the table, and fill that gap.

- **What is the role of RRED in our system?**
 - Where does race equity fit? Is this a subcommittee?
 - Should RRED be in every committee?
 - Should it be separate from everything? Stand on its own?

Discussion on what we should work on for our meetings. Is Data our main focus, and with the outcome and analysis of data do we hand off to let another subcommittee focus on recommendations and trainings? The other question is should RRED do everything, collect data, analyze, make recommendations and provide training?

Some members suggested that RRED should not be a subcommittee, but our own committee. It was also suggested to be run by both system and community. One member suggested that part of our committee should be to work in the community. Participate in activities that are happening in the community. Partner with community agencies that have not been invited to RRED. There was discussion on RRED being a part of the 8 core strategies in JDAI. Maybe looking at RRED groups nationally and reviewing their goals and what those goals look like in our system. How do we open up the system to the community, give them access to understand what we do (training)?
